Dear Mr. Stephenson,

I have a very simple question to ask, as a US Citizen, before I make a decision as to whether or not I will renew my cell phone service with you.

Have you stopped supplying information or communications from my cell phone or from any other data source at your disposal, to the Federal Government or any agency thereof, absent a legally obtained warrant signed by a Federal Judge?

The Bush administration has confirmed for the first time that American telecommunications companies played a crucial role in the National Security Agency's domestic eavesdropping program after asserting for more than a year that any role played by them was a "state secret." *New York Times* 8/24/07

If you are still providing information to any third parties absent a warrant, I have a right under federal law to be specifically notified in writing of that fact. Providing such information is a violation of the 4th Amendment of the US Constitution absent a duly executed search warrant specifically naming the person(s) and probably cause for obtaining said warrant.

I also cite the following from your own published privacy statement which says, in part;

Under federal law, you have a right, and we have a duty, to protect the confidentiality of information about your telephone usage, the services you buy from us, who you call, and the location of your device on our network when you make a voice call. Before sharing CPNI in any other way, we will first notify you of your rights under the law, describe how we intend to use the CPNI, and give you an opportunity to opt out of such usage (or, when required by law, to opt in).

Also note that by this letter I am officially notifying you that I choose to "**Opt Out**" and require that you inform me at anytime in which you intend to provide any "CPNI" to any party outside of your organization as specified in your own privacy policy.
